

# Sega Genesis Motherboard Replacement

This guide will show you how to replace the motherboard in the Sega Genesis

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• Phillips #1 Screwdriver (1)

#### Step 1 — Outer Case




 Remove the six screws from the underside of the console with a Phillips #1 screwdriver.

# Step 2




Flip the Sega Genesis upright.




- Gently lift the top casing.
- Note: the case will be connected to the main board by LED wires.

# Step 4



 Bend out the LED leads into vertical positions.



- Slide the LED wire apparatus off the lead pins.
- Note: observe which color wire corresponds with which length of pin.

## Step 6




 Separate the main board from the outer case.

#### **Step 7** — **Motherboard**



 Remove single black screw from the outside of the bottom cover, using a Philips screwdriver.

## Step 8




Using a Philips screwdriver, remove
11 screws securing silver casing.



Remove silver case.

## Step 10




- Remove single golden screw on motherboard using Philips screwdriver.
- Note: Push headphone jack to the side.



 Remove two black screws on the left and right sides of the cartridge slot.

# Step 12



Remove motherboard.



Re-install new motherboard.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
